COUNTRY SOLUTIONS

Universidad Central de Nicaragua International Programs School of Environmental and Waste Management takes a particular country solutions approach.

This approach takes country specific requirements in the given study areas into account in designing qualifications and degrees profiles matching the countries distinctive features. That aims at providing college level education and practical skills for a given country.

In order to achieve this goal we will focus on collaborations with educational providers, institutions, and industry federations and boards.

COUNTRY SPAIN

The study language of all programmes intended for Spain and Latin America is Spanish.

Universidad Central de Nicaragua International Programs School of Environmental and Waste Management will pursue and foster collaborations with recognized course providers and those, whose degrees are accepted in the professional world.

COUNTRY UNITED KINGDOM

The study language of all programmes intended for the United Kingdom (GB) is English.

Universidad Central de Nicaragua International Programs School of Environmental and Waste Management will first and foremost pursue and foster collaboration with WAMITAB and with the Chartered Institution of Wastes Management CIWM.

The objective of the approach is to design and offer specific higher education in the United Kingdom, available to professionals in the environmental and waste management industry through combinations of blended learning and long-distance education.

COUNTRY AUSTRIA

The study language of all Austrian programmes is German.

Universidad Central de Nicaragua International Programs School of Environmental and Waste Management will pursue and foster collaboration with the national Fachverband der Abfall- und Abwasserwirtschaft der Wirtschaftskammer Osterreich, and the nine regional chambers Fachgruppen der Abfall- und Abwasserwirtschaft, as with the educational bodies of commerce and labour: WIFI Wirtschaftsfoerderungsinstitut der Wirtschaftskammer Osterreich and with Bfi Berufsfoerderungsinstitut.

UCN PI will pursue collaborations with the OWAV Osterreichischer Abwasser- und Abfallwirtschaftsverband, with VOEB Verband Osterreichischer Entsorgungsbetriebe, and various organisations in the environmental and waste management sector.

The objective of the approach is to design and offer an Austria-specific higher education available to professionals in the environmental and waste management industry through combination of blended learning and long-distance education.

The double degree programme is a specific Austrian feature. Students of UCN PI School of Environmental and Waste Management at the Master's level can earn the second degree MBA in General Management, awarded by Joseph-Schumpeter Institut Wels (WWEDU).

EUROPEAN PROGRAMMES

UCN International Programs Division School of Environmental and Waste Management will partner and collaborate with institutions and organisations particularly within the European Union in fostering environmental and waste management awareness and skills.

The School of Environmental and Waste Management will work on establishing co-operations with international associations and networks in the study areas, like FEAD European Federation of Waste Management and Environmental Services.

The objective of collaborating with FEAD is the recognition of UCN PI School of Environmental and Waste Management sector specific degrees and the development and conduct of a genuine international "Master of European Waste Management" degree programme.

INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMMES

UCN International Programs Division School of Environmental and Waste Management will partner and collaborate with institutions and organisations globally in fostering environmental and waste management awareness and skills.

The School of Environmental and Waste Management will work on establishing co-operations with international universities and university networks in the study areas, like United Nations University and Global Virtual University, as well as with organisations, such as UNITAR, CIFAL, WASTE and ACEPESA, as well as with the Air & Waste Management Association A & WMA, and with ISWA, and with SANET to name but a few.
